



The Chamber of Reflection



The Encyclopedia of Freemasonry states that: the Chamber of Reflection is a small room adjoining the Lodge, in which preparatory to Initiation, the Candidate is enclosed for the purpose of indulging in the most serious of meditations which its somber appearance and gloomy emblems with which

it is furnished are calculated to produce. It is also used in concordant bodies of Masonry.

The basic idea of this room is meditation. The room is always dark, illuminated by a candle with walls painted anywhere from plain black to an imitation of a cave. Within the room is found a simple wooden table and objects to guide the Candidate through his meditation. Objects such as a human skull resting on two crossed femur bones, an hourglass, a lit candle and snuffer, a chunk of bread, a cup of water, a cup of fresh sea salt, a cup of sulphur, paper and a pen, a black equilateral triangle, Death and Fool tarot cards, A Last Will and Testament form, Alchemical symbols for Mercury, Salt and Sulphur and a scythe. It is very common to find such things like a picture of a Rooster and the letters V.I.T.R.I.O.L placed or painted on the wall above the table and a wooden stool or chair for the Candidate to sit on. The order in which these items are placed varies throughout the progression of the Candidate's journey through the degrees.

The idea of the Chamber is to symbolize death followed by rebirth. When entering a Chamber of Reflection, its gloomy appearance gives you the sense that your time on Earth is short, therefore there is only a short time to do good deeds.

The "rebirth" after leaving the Chamber is also intended to give a sense of regression back to the Mother's womb, symbolizing innocence. Once the Candidate leaves the Chamber, he is reborn. This also represents the regression to the stage of primordial man, living in caves and leaving them in order to seek wisdom and enlightenment.

The Chamber of Reflection

In our case, the Chamber is not a permanent fixture to our Lodge, and so Zetland Wilson Lodge A.F.&A.M. No. 86 G.R.C. has incorporated them in the text of the **scroll** presented to the Candidate on his entering the Chamber.

These warnings, such as:

"IF YOU THINK WE WILL FIND OUT YOUR DEFECTS, YOU WILL FEEL UNCOMFORTABLE AMONG US"

"IF CURIOSITY SPURS YOU TOWARDS US, GO AWAY!"

"IF YOU ARE CAPABLE OF DECEPTION, TREMBLE! YOU WILL BE FOUND OUT!"

"IF YOU TAKE NOTICE OF HUMAN DIFFERENCES, LEAVE! WE DO NOT KNOW THEM HERE!"

"IF YOUR SOUL IS FEARFUL, DO NOT PROCEED!"

"IF YOU PERSEVERE, YOU WILL BE PURIFIED, YOU WILL OVERCOME DARKNESS, YOU WILL BE ENLIGHTENED!"

These warnings are designed to provoke a response and show that, to Masons, to walk through that door is a serious undertaking and should not be embarked upon lightly.

In conclusion, The Chamber of Reflection teaches us powerful lessons. It is instrumental in the process of Initiation and that nobody can transform Man but Himself. It is also a place of reflection and meditation for Masons.


All our recent Candidates were introduced to the CH. of R. to begin their journey into our gentle craft and they made good use it.

Images for CHAMBER OF REFLECTION

The cup of **Water** represents the source of life and is connected to the symbol of salt in that salt comes from sea water and is necessary for the retention of water by living organisms. It is the vehicle for our psychic or emotional life, as is seen in our tears, our blood and sexual fluids.



V.I.T.R.I.O.L or vitriol is a sulphuric acid which is also used in alchemy. In an esoteric sense, it is an acronym for the latin "Visita Interiora Terrae Rectificando Invenies Occultum Lapidem" Translation; "Visit the Interior of the Earth and Rectify, You will find the Hidden Stone". With regards to Masonry, this means to search deep within oneself to discover the truth of oneself and the solution to all our problems. Enlightenment.

In addition to these objects we include the **Death Tarot card or Scythe** representing the fragility and mortality of human life and the need to be alert and awake to the reality of change and transformation that is constantly going on around and inside of us. It is the symbol of Universal Justice for "as we sow, so shall we reap".

The **black equilateral triangle** is the symbol of manifestation, of matter, Saturn and all things concrete and yet passing.

The **Last Will and Testament** symbolizes our heart's desire, the true inner expression of our personality as we seek to transcend it and enter into the divine world.


The **Pen and Paper** are used in some Masonic traditions to write answers to specific questions used to prove their proficiency in order to advance to the next degree. Some Lodges around the world practice these exercises and the WM will review the Candidate's answers before allowing the rite of passage to commence and the Candidate to advance.

There are certain warnings to be found, written on the walls of the Chamber.

The Chamber of Reflection

The **Skull and thigh bones** and the hourglass symbolize mortality. The thigh bones represent strength and virility; the skull represents death, the cycle of life.

The **hourglass** represents our time of life, the passing and marking of time, as well as the ability of the human consciousness, or soul, to experience 'timelessness' or genuine immortality despite the passing of earthly things. We also find several elements from Alchemical teachings, which are shown within the Chamber. The Alchemist's goal was to




turn worthless metals into priceless metals, metamorphically, this is in line with Freemasonry, and this is called "The refinement of man" or The Great Work". Such alchemical symbols and objects are represented on the wooden table:

The **Sulphur** on the table symbolizes "spirit" or the consciousness of man. It is seen as the soul of the mineral world.

The **Salt** is a symbol of all life and purity. It represents the fundamental matrix of physical life. It is also a symbol for the 'Elect', or those who by free will and choice elect to serve deity and to become craftsman in the building of the Divine Temple on Earth.

The last of the alchemical elements is **Mercury** though it is not physically present due to its toxic nature, it is represented by the Rooster on the wall with reference to Hermes who happens to be also known as Mercury.

The **Rooster** also represents the coming of a new dawn after the darkness of ignorance and fear. It is also the omen foretelling spiritual trial and testing.



The **chunk of bread** represents the transformation of the vegetable world, through the use of scythe and fire (the candle) into a processed form of energy and life sustaining product. Through the proper use of our skills we can create life sustaining and therefore consciousness sustaining products that advance human life and well being.
